Mother's Day Tribute in Display Case

Carol Bump, from Albany, is sharing items from her collection that bring Mothers to mind; in this instance, her mother, grandmother, and mother-in-law. This display of pink feminine china figures, hankies, lace and pearls should remind us all of our own mothers and grandmothers.

There are framed postcards and other cards that were her grandmothers on the first and second shelves. Two lacy pink cup/saucers, one with the word "Mother" embossed on it, serve as a background for 9 birthday angels from January, March and July which represent the birthdays of Carol, her mother and her daughter. There are also 4 china lady figurines on top of a flowered hinged box and two white picture frames on the first shelf.

The second shelf holds more than fifteen flowered china bud vases all purchased for under \$10. The framed postcards, a pot of pink flowers, a white lacy pillow, and a framed photo of Carol and her sister ready for Sunday School complete the look.

Beautiful hankies, including some inscribed "Mother" in their original box and some on an old hanky box belonging to her mother-in-law, are presented along with a china lady playing a piano, a pink glass cracker jar and pink glass plate from her grandmother, as well as pink dresser accessories. Lace doilies and pearls worn at her wedding as well as at her children's weddings complete this shelf.
