He much preferred studying bugs in the baseball outfield to actually playing baseball. Ness is fascinated by mimicry in insects and the way in which some bugs resemble another insect that has a sting or some other special effective defense mechanism. Insects use this mimicry to fool birds, animals and even people. The resemblance is so good that it is almost impossible to tell the difference between the model (the insect with the sting) and the mimic (the insect with no de-Some examples in the fense). case are robber flies and syrphid flies that mimic bumble bees, honey bees and wasps. Look for them!
