Roosters & Chickens Nest in the Display Case

Velma Schuett and her daughter, Barb Unke, have filled our display case with chickens and roosters of all sizes, shapes & kinds. If you like chickens, roosters, and chicks, this is the place to be for the month of September.

Every year Barb goes to Marquette during Labor Day Weekend visiting lots of flea markets looking for treasures—chickens and roosters! Their chickens are made from fabric, ceramics, metal, wood, resin, shells, dried reeds, paper, thread and more.

In addition to a fantastic shell rooster & hen, there are salt & pepper sets, vases, condiment jar sets, bookends, an egg cooker, chicken in a ladle, note pads, stationary, canisters, pillows, blackboard with a message for viewers, jello molds, cups, bowls, wall hangings, quilts, a Red Comb rooster feed bag, chicken lamp, shot glass, chicken candles in cracked egg shells, and an alarm clock that crows.

In addition to the Red Comb feed bag advertisement, there are tins advertising rooster chew, and a great old Kellogg's Corn Flakes rooster box with a matching rooster cereal bowl. Some of the collection pieces come from Italy, Mexico, and the Philippines.

Velma is famous for making Memory Boxes for her children, grandchildren, etc. and there is an example of one that she made for Barb. In them, Velma puts some of her own jewelry, a photo, some sort of butterfly, & in this one, two zippers, two crochet hooks, tiny roosters & chickens, scissors, and materials since Barb collects chickens too and sews. On a whimsical note, there is a spotted painted muffin tin with a painted "rock" hen setting in a nest in each muffin cup. Another unusual item is the farm scene chicken magnetic board which holds many chicken magnets.

Velma's daughter, Lonna Field, has made many of the wall hangings and the beautiful chicken quilt on the bottom shelf. She has also made some of the chicken craft items in the case.

A library display wouldn't be complete without books on the subject and interspersed among the baskets of hens & chicks setting in nests are copies of the famous series of Chicken Soup books, The Little Red Hen, and Good Morning Farm.

Thank you so much Velma and Barb for sharing your love of roosters, hens, and chicks with us. There is a guest book for viewers to sign in and comment on the display so Velma will know how much enjoyment it's bringing to Monticello library patrons.
