### Mother Goose Plates In Display Case

Karen Koca has graciously agreed to display her collection of limited edition Mother Goose Collectors Plates. The set is comprised of eight different wellknown Mother Goose nursery rhymes painted on plates. These plates were commissioned from 1979s through 1986 by Reco International.

Jack McClellan painted one plate each year for this exclusive limited edition set. The first plate was "Mary, Mary Quite Contrary" and the last one was "Jack & Jill.

Other plates in the series are "Little Boy Blue," "Little Miss Muffet," "Little Jack Horner," "Little Bo Beep," "Diddle, Diddle Dumpling," and "Mary Had a Little Lamb."

John McClellan is a well known artist and illustrator from Georgia. His sensitive portraits of children grace many different types of collectors plates. In all, he has produced more than 40 limited edition collectors plates. He also has done portraits of Caroline Kennedy as a child for the covers of Good Housekeeping and Woman's Day magazines.

Twelve years ago, Karen inherited the collection from her mother, June Weber Wild who lived in Belleville. Mrs. Wild housed her collection in a beautiful handmade shelf which now hangs in Karen's office.

Thank you, Karen for sharing this fabulous collection with us. It's now time for us all to fondly recall the Mother Goose nursery rhymes from our child-hood. The library has many books of nursery rhymes available for checkout for the child in each of us.
